About Sanctuary Supported Living

At Sanctuary Supported Living we provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support to help people across England on their pathway to independence.

We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

Location

Within walking distance of supermarkets, shops, Banbury College, GPs and dentists, as well as public transport links to Bicester and Oxford. Nearby leisure facilities include a cinema, an arts centre and a bowling alley.



Accommodation type

8 part-furnished, one-bedroomed flats



Communal areas

A lounge and small garden area.



WiFi

Communal Wi-Fi is available to all residents in communal areas.



Safety and security

Staff office on-site, CCTV and a secure door access system to ensure residents' safety and security.



Rental agreement type

All flats are let on an assured shorthold tenancy.

Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence. Staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Life Star model, to help them achieve their aims and goals. Staff support residents to manage and improve their personal safety and improve social, emotional and mental wellbeing.

Our highly-trained staff are on-site, and their hours of work vary between 7:30am – 10:30pm. There is an overnight concierge service seven days a week, should residents require any further assistance.

Tailored support, advice and assistance includes:

- Maintaining a tenancy, managing rent
- Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- Daily living skills
- Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- Socialising and community involvement
- Maintaining health, safety and security
- Managing appropriate behaviour and good communication
- Dealing with correspondence
- Signposting and accessing other services

How to apply and eligibility

We accept referrals from Oxfordshire County Council's learning disability, autism and specialist mental health brokerage team. To apply, email **LDandMHBrokerage@oxfordshire.gov.uk**. All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

To be eligible for a place at Dashwood House, applicants must:

- Be aged 18 or over
- Have a learning disability and/or autism as their primary support need
