CARE AND SUPPORT

We have extensive experience in supporting people with learning disabilities who require support with their everyday needs, encouraging them to develop their skills and live as independently as possible.

Our structured package of tailored support uses the Life Star model to agree a personalised support plan, helping residents to identify their needs and aspirations. Their progress is regularly monitored and reviewed with the plan updated to reflect any changing needs. All support is designed to help residents achieve good emotional health and improve their wellbeing and quality of life. Our highly-trained staff provide a wide range of tailored support, advice and assistance, including:

- Day-to-day general needs
- Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- Dealing with correspondence

- Managing personal care and medication
- Developing hobbies and interests
- Maintaining health, safety and security
- Signposting and accessing other services

ACCOMMODATION

High Worple is located in a quiet, residential area of Harrow, within walking distance of shops, Roxbourne Park, supermarkets and public transport links.

Spread over two floors, there are five single-occupancy bedrooms in a shared house. Residents are encouraged to furnish and decorate their room to suit their individual taste. The communal areas include a lounge-diner, kitchen, bathroom and large garden, providing residents with space to relax in peace and quiet, or socialise with others.

An intercom secure door access system is used to help to ensure residents' safety and security.

HOW TO APPLY AND ELIGIBILITY

We accept referrals from Harrow Council, as well as self-referrals. All care and support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

Applicants must be aged 18 or over and have a diagnosed learning disability.
