At Sanctuary Supported Living we provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support to help people across England on their pathway to independence.

We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.



## Accommodation



### Accommodation type

Five partly furnished, single-occupancy bedrooms in a shared house across two floors.



### Location

Within walking distance of shops, supermarkets, restaurants, leisure facilities, and transport links.



### Communal areas

A lounge, dining room, kitchen, accessible bathroom, and garden.



### Technology

Free Wi-Fi in communal areas. We can provide assistive technology for extra safety and reassurance, which can be purchased at additional cost.



### Safety and security

Staff available onsite during various hours and out of hours telephone support to ensure residents' safety and security.



### Rental agreement type

All bedrooms are let on an assured shorthold tenancy agreement.

## Support

Staff provide personalised, intensive housing management support to residents to help them maintain their tenancy and achieve their goals.

Our highly trained staff are on-site during various hours to suit residents' needs.

Residents can also purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.

### Tailored support, advice and assistance includes:

- Maintaining a tenancy, managing rent
- Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- Dealing with correspondence
- Daily living skills
- Accessing education, training and employment
- Planning a successful move-on
- Signposting and accessing other services
- Building confidence, resilience and self-esteem
- Issuing and enforcing occupancy agreements
- Managing rent and arrears
- Managing anti-social behaviour
- Mediation of neighbour disputes

## How to apply and eligibility

We accept direct applications. Contact us below for an enquiry form. We also accept referrals from Enfield Council and out of borough referrals.

All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

### To be eligible for a place at Church Street, applicants must:

- Be aged 18 and over
- Have a mental health diagnosis

When residents are ready to move into their own, independent accommodation, we can provide low level, move-on support.
