About Sanctuary Supported Living

At Sanctuary Supported Living we provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support to help people across England on their pathways for independence.

We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

Accommodation



Accommodation type

Eight fully-furnished en-suite rooms in a shared house. There is WiFi in all communal areas and level access throughout.



Location

Salford, close to shops, restaurants, green spaces and leisure facilities and served by good public transport links.



Communal areas

A lounge, dining room, kitchen, laundry room and level-access garden.



Technology

Free Wi-Fi available to all residents in communal areas.



Safety and security

Staff office on-site, CCTV, secure door access system and on-site security to ensure residents' feel safe and secure.



Rental agreement type

All rooms are let on a licence agreement.

Support

Staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Mental Health Recovery Star model. Our highly trained staff are on-site 24 hours a day, seven days a week, plus there is an out-of-hours telephone service, should residents require any further support.

We also provide move-on support to help prepare residents for living independently as well as floating support to people living in the local area. Residents can purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.

Tailored support, advice and assistance includes:

- › Daily living skills
- › Maintaining a tenancy
- › Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- › Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- › Accessing education, training and employment
- › Managing mental health needs
- › Dealing with correspondence
- › Socialising and community involvement
- › Building confidence, resilience and self-esteem
- › Maintaining appropriate behaviour and good communication

How to apply and eligibility

We accept referrals from Salford Community Mental Health team or Salford City Council's Adult Social Care team. All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

To be eligible for a place at Gore Avenue, applicants must:

- › Be aged 18 or over
- › Have diagnosed complex mental health needs
