At Sanctuary Supported Living we provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support to help people across England on their pathways for independence.

We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

Accommodation



Accommodation type

13 part-furnished one-bedroom apartments, each with a bedroom, lounge/diner, kitchen and shower room.



Location

A residential area of Waterloo, close to shops and other local amenities, public transport links, colleges and the seafront.



Communal areas

A shared communal space for socialising and events.



Technology

We can provide assistive technology for extra safety and reassurance, which can be purchased at additional cost.



Safety and security

Staff office on-site, CCTV and a secure door access system help to ensure residents' safety and security.



Rental agreement type

All apartments are let on an assured shorthold tenancy agreement.

Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence. Staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Mental Health Recovery Star model.

Our highly-trained staff are on-site various hours through the week, to suit residents' needs. There is an out-of-hours telephone service, should residents require any further support. Residents can purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.

Tailored support and assistance includes:

- › Maintaining a tenancy
- › Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- › Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- › Building confidence, resilience and self-esteem
- › Developing hobbies and interests
- › Dealing with correspondence
- › Accessing education, training and work
- › Maintaining health, safety and security
- › Signposting and accessing other services
- › Planning a successful move-on

How to apply and eligibility

We accept referrals from Crosby Housing's Community Housing and Re-Enablement Team (CHART). For more information, or to apply to live at Church Road, visit CHART website or call 0151 928 2777. All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

To be eligible for a place at Church Road, applicants must:

- › Be aged 18 to 65
- › Have a mental health need and require supported accommodation
- › Be receiving support from the Community Mental Health (CMHT)
