Cooking up a storm at Oak Lodge

Residents at Sanctuary Supported Living's Oak Lodge, a short-term supported housing service for adults with learning disabilities in Attleborough, Norfolk, have been



learning new skills and enjoying delicious meals, thanks to support from Sanctuary Supported Living staff.

Will Childe, Hospitality Services Manager, who oversees the catering and hospitality services across Sanctuary Supported Living, including their commercial kitchens, spent two days with the residents to teach them about cooking tasty meals on a budget. To support the project, Sanctuary Supported Living donated two slow cookers and an air fryer to the Oak Lodge residents. With Will's support, the residents used their new kitchen gadgets to prepare a variety of classic dishes – including spaghetti bolognese, beef stew, roast chicken and chilli con carne.

Will covered the basics of food safety and showed the residents how to use up leftovers to make healthy and delicious new dishes, while also saving money and reducing food waste. Will also offered further follow-up support to the residents, including access to a bank of over 1,300 recipes, as well as Sanctuary Supported Living's Eating Well for Less recipe book and advice guide. The residents will also have the opportunity to complete food safety courses, leading to a food safety level 2 certificate.

Will said: "It was a pleasure to visit Oak Lodge. The residents were very engaged and enthusiastic, and they enjoyed eating the food they cooked. We spent £70 and made 64 portions of food – which works out at just £1.10 per meal. I hope they've been inspired to get creative on a budget in the kitchen, and that the skills they've gained will help them when they move on to living independently."
