We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

Location

The centre of Wandsworth, with easy access to shops, supermarkets, restaurants, leisure facilities, South Thames College, King George's Park and public transport links.



Accommodation type

20 self-contained fully-furnished one-bedroom flats.



Communal areas

A lounge, kitchen, laundry room and a garden.



Technology

Free Wi-Fi in communal areas. We can provide assistive technology for additional safety and reassurance, which can be purchased at additional cost.



Safety and security

A staff office and security personnel on-site, CCTV and a secure door access system all help to ensure residents' safety and security.

All flats are let on protected licences.

Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence. Staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Mental Health Recovery Star model.

Our highly-trained staff are on-site seven days a week during office hours, giving residents peace of mind that support is always on-hand. Residents can purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.

Tailored support and assistance includes:

- › Daily living skills
- › Maintaining a tenancy
- › Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- › Maintaining health, safety and security
- › Managing personal care and medication
- › Dealing with correspondence
- › Signposting and accessing other services
- › Accessing education, training and employment
- › Managing mental health needs
- › Planning a successful move-on

How to apply and eligibility

We are unable to accept direct applications.

We can only accept referrals from the Specialist Housing Accommodation Project (SHAP) team, which serves both Richmond Council and Wandsworth Council.

All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

To be eligible for a place at John Pounds House, applicants must:

- › Be aged 18 or over
- › Have a mental health need
- › Be able to work towards living independently within two years
