We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

11 part-furnished single-occupancy bedrooms in a shared house, including one bedroom with an ensuite.



Free Wi-Fi in communal areas. We can provide assistive technology for extra safety and reassurance, which can be purchased at additional cost.



A residential area of Braintree, close to shops, supermarkets, public transport links and local leisure facilities and amenities.



There is a staff office on-site, and CCTV and a secure door access system help to ensure residents' safety and security.



A dining room, two kitchens, a lounge, activity room, laundry room and garden.



All bedrooms are let on an excluded licence agreement.

Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence. Staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Home Star model, to help them achieve their goals.

Our highly trained staff are on-site during office hours. There is also an out-of-hours telephone service, should residents require any further support. Residents can also purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.

Tailored support, advice and assistance includes:

- Maintaining a tenancy
- Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- > Dealing with correspondence
- Daily living skills
- > Accessing education, training and employment
- Signposting and accessing other services
- > Building confidence, resilience and self-esteem
- Preventing homelessness
- > Managing mental health needs
- Planning a successful move-on

How to apply and eligibility

We accept referrals from Braintree Council, please contact them to complete a homeless application.

All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

To be eligible for a place at Glen House, applicants must:

- > Be aged 18 to 64
- Have low support needs
- Be a single adult and homeless or at risk of homelessness
