At Sanctuary Supported Living we provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support to help people across England on their pathways for independence.

We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

Accommodation type

Eight part-furnished one-bedroom apartments, each a lounge/diner, kitchen and shower room.



Location

A residential area of Runcorn, within walking distance of shops, leisure facilities, parks and public transport links.



Communal areas

A shared lounge, kitchen with laundry facilities and a garden.



Technology

Wi-Fi is available to all residents in communal areas. We can provide assistive technology for added reassurance at an additional cost.



Safety and security

Staff office on-site, an intercom system and CCTV to ensure residents' safety and security.



Rental agreement type

All apartments are let on an assured shorthold tenancy agreement.

Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence.

Our highly-trained staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Life Star model.

Staff are on-site at various hours during the day, to suit residents' needs, giving them peace of mind that support is on-hand.

There is an out-of-hours telephone service, should residents require any further support.

Tailored support, advice and assistance includes:

- Maintaining a tenancy
- Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- Building positive relationships
- Developing hobbies and interests
- Dealing with correspondence
- Socialising and community involvement
- Maintaining health, safety and security
- Signposting and accessing other services
- Building confidence, resilience and self-esteem

How to apply and eligibility

We only accept referrals from Halton Borough Council's Complex Care Team.

All care and support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

To be eligible for a place at Halton Road, applicants must:

- Be aged 18 or over
- Have a learning disability
- Require a minimum of 13 hours of support per week

Residents can purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.
