Sudbury Young People Supported Housing supports up to 14 vulnerable young people aged 16 to 24, who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

- ▶ Staff on-site to suit residents' needs, including overnight
- ▶ Short-term supported housing for up to two years
- ▶ Communal facilities include kitchen, lounge and garden

About Sanctuary Supported Living

At Sanctuary Supported Living we provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support to help people across England on their pathways for independence.

We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.



Accommodation



Accommodation type

A shared house with a total of 14 single-occupancy bedrooms.



Location

Close to the town centre, shops, restaurants, parks, and public transport links.



Communal areas

A lounge, dining area, kitchen, and garden.



Technology

Free Wi-Fi in communal areas. We can provide assistive technology for additional safety and reassurance, which can be purchased at additional cost.



Safety and security

A staff office on-site with overnight concierge, CCTV and a secure door access system ensure residents' safety and security.



Rental agreement type

All bedrooms are let on a licence agreement.

Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence. Our highly-trained staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Young Person's Star model. Staff are on-site during various hours to suit residents' needs.

There is an overnight concierge service and an out-of-hours telephone service, should residents require further support outside of office hours.

They can also purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.

Tailored support and assistance includes:

- › Maintaining a tenancy
- › Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- › Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- › Building confidence, resilience and self-esteem
- › Developing hobbies and interests
- › Dealing with correspondence
- › Accessing education, training and work
- › Maintaining health, safety and security
- › Signposting and accessing other services
- › Planning a successful move-on

How to apply and eligibility

To apply, complete Suffolk County Council's application for housing-related support.

All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

To be eligible for a place at Sudbury Young People Supported Housing, applicants must:

- › Be aged 16 to 24
- › Be homeless or at risk of homelessness
- › Be willing to access housing-related support and engage with our services
- › Be assessed as low-risk and require low to medium level support
