## About Sanctuary Supported Living

At Sanctuary Supported Living we provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support to help people across England on their pathway for independence.

We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

## Accommodation



### Accommodation type

A total of three rooms in a shared house with level access throughout. All rooms are part-furnished.



### Location

A quiet residential area of Chester, situated within walking distance of shops, leisure facilities, two parks and public transport links.



### Communal areas

A kitchen, bathroom, lounge area, laundry room and garden.



### Technology

Wi-Fi is available to all residents in communal areas. We can provide assistive technology for added reassurance at an additional cost.



### Safety and security

Staff office on-site and an out-of-hours telephone service to ensure residents' safety and security.



### Rental agreement type

All accommodation is let on an assured shorthold tenancy agreement.

## Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence.

Our highly-trained staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents using the Life Star model. They are on-site various hours during the day, to suit residents' needs, giving residents peace of mind that support is on-hand.

Residents can access an out-of-hours telephone service for additional support and have the option to purchase telecare technology to enhance their independence.

### Tailored support, advice, and assistance includes:

- Maintaining a tenancy
- Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- Daily living skills
- Developing hobbies and interests
- Dealing with correspondence
- Socialising and community involvement
- Maintaining health, safety and security
- Signposting and accessing other services
- Building positive relationships, confidence, resilience and self-esteem

## How to apply and eligibility

We accept referrals from the Adult Learning Disabilities team Cheshire West and Cheshire Council. All support needs will be assessed before an application is accepted.

### To be eligible for a place at Gleneagles Close, applicants must:

- Be aged 18 or over
- Have a low to moderate learning disability
- Have a minimum of 10.5 care and support hours per week
