At Sanctuary Supported Living we deliver personalised care and support services to help people on their pathway to independence.

We provide supported housing, move-on accommodation, CQC registered services and floating support. We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

CARE AND SUPPORT

At Rachel House and Dashwood House, we provide supported housing to single young parents, aged 16-25, and their children.

Our structured package of tailored support uses the Young Person's Star model to agree a personal support plan, enabling residents to identify their needs and achieve their goals. Their progress is regularly monitored and reviewed with their plan updated to reflect any changing needs. Residents are encouraged to take control of their lives and build on their skills and strengths. Our highly-trained staff are on-site seven days a week and provide a wide range of tailored support, including:

- Daily living skills
- Maintaining a tenancy
- Managing finances (budgeting and benefits)
- Parenting skills
- Maintaining health, safety and security
- Accessing education, training and employment
- Signposting and accessing other services
- Planning a successful move-on

At Rachel House, residents are provided with more support than at Dashwood House, where residents generally have lower-level support needs.

ACCOMMODATION

Rachel House and Dashwood House are within walking distance of supermarkets, shops, nurseries, Banbury College, GPs and dentists, as well as public transport links to Bicester and Oxford. Nearby leisure facilities include a cinema, an arts centre and a bowling alley.

There are 11 bedsits in Rachel House and 9 flats in the adjoining Dashwood House. All bedsits and flats are partly furnished, with a bathroom and kitchen. In Rachel House, the communal facilities include a lounge, kitchen, laundry room, bathroom and garden play area, giving residents space to socialise or enjoy peace and quiet. Residents from Dashwood House also have access to the lounge, kitchen and garden. CCTV and a staff office at Rachel House, with an overnight sleep in, help to ensure residents have a safe and secure place to live.

HOW TO APPLY AND ELIGIBILITY

Referrals are made through Oxfordshire County Council's placement team. To apply, email placementservices@oxfordshire.gov.uk.

Applicants must be single, aged 16-25 and either be pregnant or have a child(ren). We may also consider accepting couples at the point of entry, please speak to staff for more details.
